We are pleased to announce formally that Reverend Rodney Roehner has enthusiastically accepted our call to be Saint Matthew's rector! After 15 months of careful preparation and reflection, our search process and the Holy Spirit has led us to Father Rodney. The search committee unanimously recommended the call to the Vestry, who in turn unanimously accepted that recommendation. We believe our prayers have been answered and we are excited for his arrival on December 20, 2020.

Father Rodney comes to us from St. Paul's Episcopal Church in New Smyrna Beach, FL, where he has been rector for 6 years. Prior to that, he was the Associate Rector and school chaplain at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in New Orleans, LA. He attended seminary at Nashotah House Seminary in Wisconsin, where he earned a Masters of Theological Studies with a concentration in Anglican Studies. He brings with him significant experience, accomplishment, spirituality, ability, and enthusiasm.

As Father Rodney noted in his letter to us, he is not new to this area. He was born and raised in Montgomery County, graduating from Methacton High School and Villanova University. Father Rodney is excited to return to the area for himself, but especially for his family. Father Rodney is married to Carolina, and together they have two children, twin 11-year-old girls, Sophia and Alexa.

On a more personal level, Father Rodney enjoys baseball, football and tennis - We hope he is still a Phillies/Eagles/Freedom's fan! He shares with us that his wife is quite the artist, and photographer so their home always looks like a studio! Carolina is also an interpreter by profession.

The twin girls, Alexa and Sophia are currently in 6th grade and have a variety of interests. They both seem to have inherited Carolina's artistic talents as well as other passions. Sophia enjoys playing the violin and piano. Alexa plays flag football, while Sophia is interested in baseball and volleyball. 
# 2021 Pledge Update:

Yes! There will be a pageant this year! It may look a little different, but Do Not Be Afraid!

What is a Virtual Pageant? A virtual pageant means that we won't be performing inside of our church building this year. Instead, we'll each record our lines in advance, combine them together, and interact with a recording being streamed live to our homes. Though this experience might feel new and maybe even a bit strange, do not be afraid! With your help, all of us will be able to create a memorable, joyful, and holy memory at Saint Matthew's this year.

How Will It Work? Anyone can participate, but we will prioritize children for the major roles! After you or your family signs up as a participant, they'll be sent a few lines from our pageant script. From there we'll ask you to record those lines, and send them to us when you're done. We'll stitch all of the clips from Saint Matthew's together into one pageant movie, which you'll be able to interact with at your home during the Advent and Christmas seasons. You'll also be able to keep pageant forever, and send it to your loved ones with the click of a button.

Around December 8th, we'll send your family a few lines to record — we'll ask if you'd like to create your own costumes, or if you'd like Saint Matthew's to lend you a few of our own. # Nursery School Update

St. Matthew's Nursery School has served the families in our community for 28 years now. It would not be unfair to say that the challenges of 2020 exceed those of any past year. Along with all other schools in Montgomery County, the Nursery School closed in March due to Covid-19. It remained closed through the remainder of that school year in order to keep our students and staff safe.

It is thanks to the commitment, dedication, and careful planning of our Nursery School director, Jackie Anderson, that we were able to make the decision to open the Nursery School in September. We are so fortunate to have a director and staff of dedicated and caring individuals who are joyfully ushering the children through this most challenging time. Implementation of strict controls that follow CDC and Montgomery County Department of Health guidelines, and the strong support of the parents, have meant that the children are able to participate in a school program at this critical time in their lives.

Enrollment is lower this year, as adjustments were needed to class size to address Covid-19 space concerns. We currently have 85 children, with a staff of 19 supporting them. The staff has been flexible and innovative in finding ways to safely continue with the programs the parents and children love. Each

week the children enjoy arts and crafts, singing, cooking, stories, academics, enrichment classes such as Mathemagic, Science, Reading Writing and Fun, Kreative Kids Art, and so much more! All brought to them with lots of love each day.

The school will continue to work diligently with their families, the church and our community to keep the staff and children safe, and provide a place for them to learn and have fun!
