St. Matthew's Family,

Let me begin by expressing my own family's heartfelt 'thank you' for the generous welcome you have provided us in so many ways, and all of it during these trying circumstances in which we find ourselves. I know many priests and parishes, and I've never heard of a such a gracious reception for a new rector. In sum, it bears witness to the main draw for us to come and be a part of St. Matthew's, its people; a point I have repeatedly heard from conversations with many of you about why you find this sacred place so unique.

This past 1½ months has involved a great deal of listening to your stories about and desires for St. Matthew's. The common themes repeatedly heard are worship services, fellowship, outreach, and youth, which happen to be the same main points expressed by the parish profile and search committee.



Being a cradle-Episcopalian, I can certainly relate to the angst we feel when anyone 'messes' with our services, so let me put any concerns to rest. As we return to in-person worship this month, we will begin with the 8 and 9:30 am services, but eventually return to the three-service schedule with which you are familiar. The 7:45 am Holy Eucharist will be Rite I, the 9 am will be the contemporary service with the Arise Music Team, and the 10:30 am Holy Eucharist will be Rite II with choir. The vibrancy of all three of those offerings is very important to me, as I'm sure it is to those attending them!

Fellowship has been repeatedly mentioned in discussions, and there may be few things we look forward to resuming more than physically joining together with our brothers and sisters in Christ. Space here precludes going into this in depth, but opportunities to gather (inside and outside) are a priority for the Vestry and me.

Of course, one of the ways in which we share fellowship with our St. Matthew's family is by extending it to others. There is a strong desire to find our place regarding outreach in our community. The first place we can direct our attention is no farther than our preschool, and, having always ministered in churches with schools, we will focus on that significant opportunity for interaction right at our doorstep. I've also heard from several of you that more ministering to our neighborhoods is needed, and we are considering areas in which we can make a positive impact that builds up the lives of others locally.

Finally, there is the point repeatedly raised about how to best serve and incorporate into our common life the youth of our parish. Many of you have praised their foundation in the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program, but we must make sure we build off that in order to enable our youth to continue to thrive and mature in the Faith up through their high school years (though it doesn't stop there!). As we explore those possibilities, I can say that the youth will be more involved in the life and worship of St. Matthew's, beginning with a Youth Sunday each month, in which they will actively participate in various parts of the services. They each have unique gifts and talents to offer, and it is never too early to encourage stewardship of their own life in Jesus Christ.

There is much wonderful work to be done in this part of the Lord's vineyard, and I am thankful to be among all of you as we minister side-by-side to extend God's Kingdom in this beautiful and sacred place in Maple Glen.



On February 8th at Saint Matt's, youth were to gather outdoors to produce ashes to go and to assemble Lenten Kits for families. Additionally and in a compliant manner, groups of 3-4 young people would have briefly toured their youth space in the Parish Hall to generate ideas for what it might look like once we fully return to the physical world. Unfortunately, the snow and frigid temperatures had different plans for us! We're rescheduling our gathering for later this month, and planning for March, Easter, Spring, and Summer are currently underway. We can't wait to *do a new thing* together soon!
